Although a number of crosses were made, few were planted -- and these quite late. Germination was good, however, and plants moved into seedling beds late in August, 1962.

Only one plant saved although there were several large flowered seedlings that were attractive. One - wide spread, narrow petalled - seemed worth saving.

1 - 1 A Pale melon - pink midrib - only moderate pinking in sun. Flowers up to 8" - wide spread - wind resistant, however. Watched, lined out, watched some more. Finally named in 1969. Tends to lean in shady spots - full sun best.

Almost all crosses were made with a definite aim in mind. However, small amounts of certain pollens were applied when secured (Ex. Satin Glass) -- and such crosses made as seemed logical with whatever was blooming that day. Some did not take for reasons unknown -- but enough did to ensure at least some variety in the seedlings with this parentage. Work toward miniature was continued and new varieties purchased for use next year. Crosses were made to start late-flowering lines. These were numbered 50 up so as to make them more easily identifiable.

2-2A Light yellow. Extremely green throat - circular in effect. Three scapes in 1964 but poor branching. Used for breeding. Held for further observation.

Plant divided in September. Decision made to name it. Placed one plant at National Headquarters Bldg. in same bed with National Council; one given to Florence; one sent as guest to Vivian Parsons; one placed in garden - remaining two in seedling bed. Roots salmony orange - quite deep color. Plant multiplied fast.

All the plants given out died. Throat still startlingly green. Branching remained poor. Perhaps is too much like Solo in flower.

1966 Two plants taken to Headquarters Building.

1967 Above plants survived. Decision made to transfer name to 4-2D

Planting cleared out. One small plant saved. Rest used for landscaping. Most of plants extremely large and vigorous.

Attractive, weather resistant melon. Not actually unusual as there are many melons. However, its vigorous growth and good appearance convinced me it would make a good addition to National Council plantings. Registered as Bonnie Hath

1964 Halo showed up in several. Some rather fulvous. These discarded at once. A few "silvers" -- not particularly distinctive. One numbered and held for more observations.

1965 Excellent branching in some. Several with Halo. Two good but not up to Boyle.

2-51 A One fairly large -- similar to Au Revoir but larger and fuller -- clearer color. Takes heat much better.

Registered as *Boyle* in 1964

1965 - closes earlier than I thought at time of registration. Otherwise very worthy even if not extremely distinctive. Drought resistant. Placed next to air conditioner west of house. Reflected heat does not bother it. Started in mid July.

1971 - Kept but never disseminated. Is nice in mixed planting.

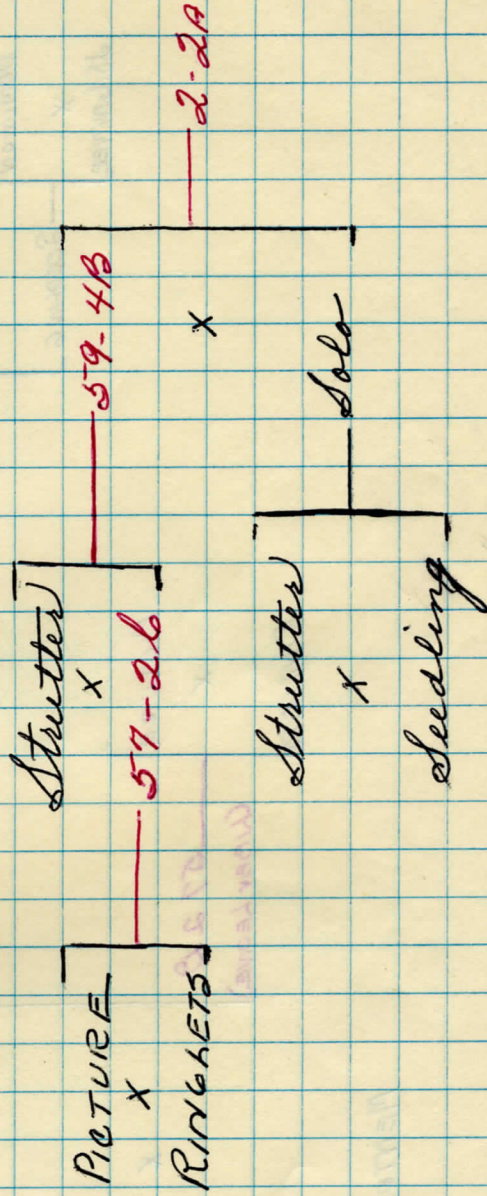


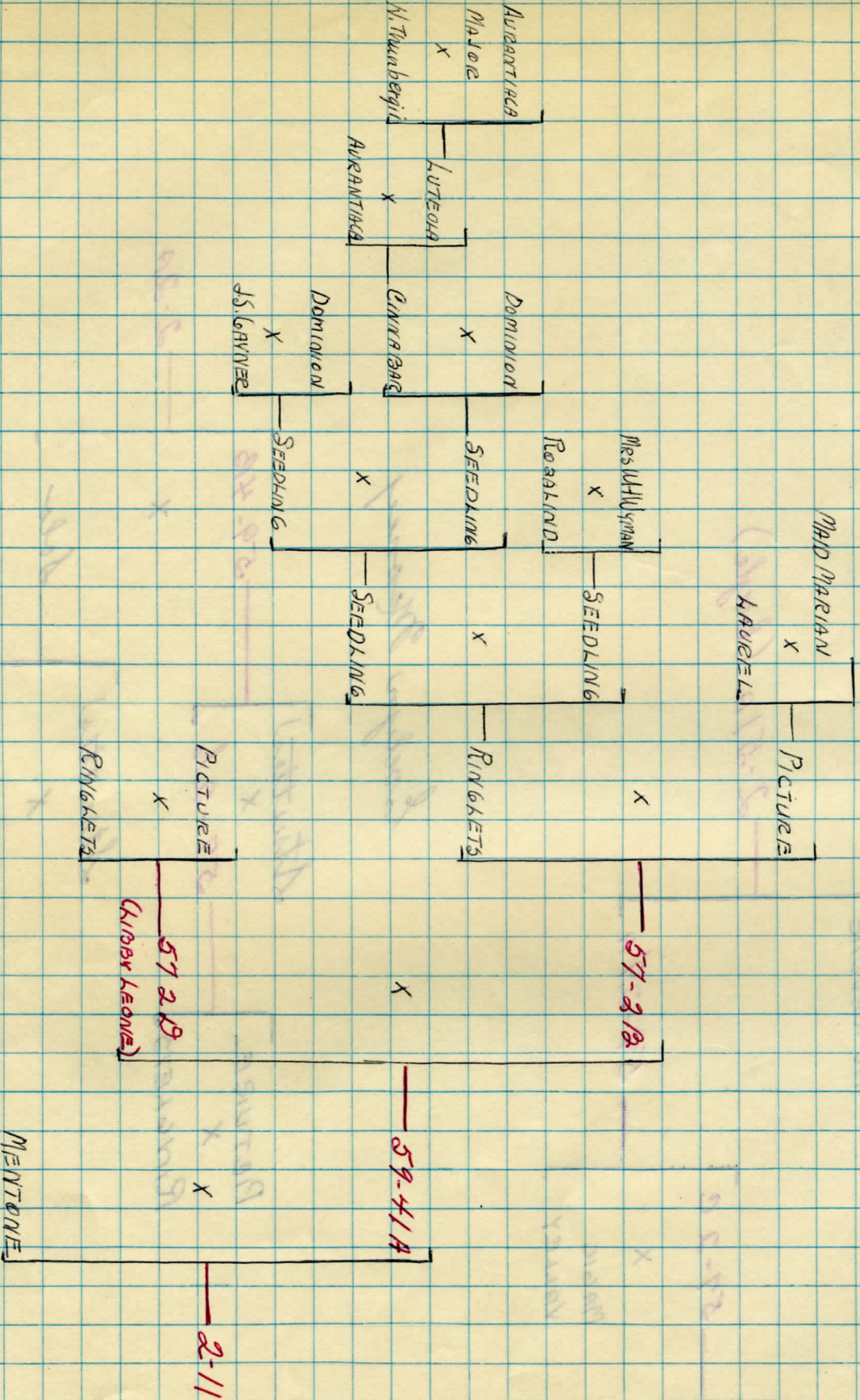
Boyle lineage
